## Message from the Chair

Attributing to our expertise in the food industry, the natural inclination was to add value within the food and nutrition sector, especially for children. The efforts in this direction took shape with the establishment of **Ekta Shakti Foundation** in the year 2003, with a vision for a world of hope, kindness and positive action, where every person has the opportunity to live a healthy and productive life.

Our intent was to provide healthy and nutritious food to every child and help specially abled children realize their potential and help reserve equal rights in the society.

Furthering this vision, our first implementation project was with the Municipal Corporation of Delhi Schools, with support from the Delhi government. This initiative marked our first project of the Mid-Day Meal Nutrition Programme from the Matiala kitchen unit in Delhi. The project came as learning, to help us establish strong parameters for ourselves. Procuring and training skilled staff to handle a specialised unit to prepare food for more than 20,000 children under predefined nutritional value and cost package of INR 2.00 per meal came as a challenge. With this challenge came the opportunity in form of strong partnership with the Sri Ram Institute, Delhi. The institute supported us in creating age specific nutritional value meals for the children and helped in testing and approval of food samples prepared in the unit under strict supervision. The partnership fruited in designing and imparting training programmes for skilled cooks and staff working in these kitchens under the quality standards mutually pre-defined.

Our service and quality got recognised by the Delhi government, which resulted in scaling up of the Mid Day Meal Project across government schools in Delhi. From 20,000 the number grew to 60,000 in a short span, including services to 100 Integrated Child Development Services school, motivating us to start our second kitchen in Delhi. We were awarded the opportunity to expand our services in Bihar reaching out to more than 6 lakhs children across five districts post a successful pilot in two districts of Bihar.

Our focus remained on catalyzing ongoing positive transformation in the lives of people, especially disadvantaged children, youth and women through equitable opportunity and inclusive development efforts.

**BrahmShakti Special School** was one such effort, initiated post identification of the need of special school in the community. It was noticed that these children were left unattended or were seen struggling for appropriate facilities. This initiative began with an objective to support the needs of specially abled children providing specialised services, making it affordable and helping them to be self reliant in their day-to-day activities, their potentials tapped and rights realised. The first school began in Delhi at Matiala center, with two students and has now grown to more than 50 students, rendering specialised services ranging from speech therapy, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, vocational courses, development of motor skills and much more.

The staff is trained in handling the needs of the children and each is certified from the Rehabilitation Centre of India.

Aligning to our focus, **Radhika Silai and Kadhai Kendra** was initiated to address the needs of women and girls, to empower them with livelihood options and work skills. This initiative provided life skills to women and girls, helping them become independent and self-reliant. The center continues to impart training in stitching, tailoring and embroidery through certification courses. Our target is to ensure free training to women, who were abandoned or widowed with no livelihood support.

The three thematic interventions kept us motivated to excel and scale our work to reach more lives. The journey so far has been exhilarating and humbling. I hope with continual support, we steer the good work raising the bar towards excellence.



# Key Milestones

2003



**Initiated the Mid Day Meal services with support from the Delhi Government in 2003.**

Reached out to 128 MCD schools and served mid day meal to approximately 20 thousand children in Delhi with support from the Delhi Government.

2005



**Started with first semi automated centralised kitchens. Introduced Radhika Silai and Kadhai Kendra in 2005.**

Catering to the requirements, the organisation inaugurated its first semi automated kitchen unit in Matiala. This high-end unit is capacitated to serve approximately to serve more than one lakh fifty thousand children.

Radhika Silai and Kadhai Kendra was initiated to train women and girls with the skills of tailoring, cutting, and embroidery for better employability. The course imparts training through 6 months and 12 months certification programme and helps the beneficiary secure employment and be part of the Self Help Groups.

2006



**Opportunity to work with Bihar Government under the Mid Day Meal Initiative in 2006.**

The organisation got awarded to implement the Mid Day Meal Nutrition initiative as a pilot project in two districts of Bihar i.e. Patna and Vaishali. The project caters to approximately 2.5 lakhs children in the region.

Initiated BrahmShakti Special School in Matiala, Delhi, to cater to the needs of specially abled children. The school is one of the first of its kind in Matiala, with trained staff offering high-end services.

2007



**Initiated Capacity Building and Training Workshops to build a sustainable workforce in the state of Bihar in 2007.**

Training and capacity building of about 500 work-force which included cooks, packaging staff, storage, maintenance staff and support staff. Menus and nutritional proportions were designed as per the given and required parameters with support from the government.

## 2008



**Inaugurated second BrahmShakti Special School in Dwarka, and second centralised semi automated kitchen unit in Delhi in 2008.**

Inaugurated the second BrahmShakti Special School center in Dwarka, equipped with specialised services and trained staff.

Second semi automated kitchen was established in Matiala Delhi, capcitated to serve more than 70 thousand children. This kitchen serves 48 government schools in Delhi.

## 2009



**Mid Day Meal Nutrition Project, expanded to 5 districts of Bihar with support from the Bihar government in 2009.**

The pilot project got recognised by the government and services got scaled upto three additonal districts. This enabled the project to approximately cater to six lakh children in five districts of Bihar (Patna, Vaishali, Gaya, Nalanda and Begusarai).

## 2010



**One of the selected organisations to cater to meals during the Common Wealth Games held in 2010, New Delhi.**

The organisation was awarded to cater meals during the commonwealth games held in Delhi in 2010. The selection was based on high quality, service and hygiene standards. Approximately 40 thousand meals got served per day.

## 2012



**Renewal of work contract with Bihar government on the basis of Service of Excellence in 2012.**

The Bihar Government appreciated the Mid Day Meal Nutrition project and the services. This was complimented by a visit and appreciation from the World Health Organisation. This resulted in the extention of the services across five districts in Bihar.

# The Nutrition Programme

Good Nutrition is the process of providing the right amount of nutrients from healthy food intake, in balanced daily required proportions.

Appropriate nutrition empowers a child to fight and combat multiple diseases and helps eradicate conditions like slow growth, underweight or overweight especially for kids less than five years of age. The initiative of Mid Day Meal is not just about ending hunger but bringing a positive change in the society, ensuring healthy lives and helping children be productive and reach their full potential.

Food through Nutrition Support initiative to primary children is popularly referred to as Mid Day Meal Scheme. Historically, the concept of Mid-day Meal Scheme started in 1960's in India. It involved provision of lunch free of cost, to school going children on all working days. This programme now popularly known as 'Annapurna Rasoi' has evolved with time, which has become unique and successful due to participation and collaboration of private sector and has demonstrated great results.

The Mid Day Meal Nutrition Programme by Ekta Shakti Foundation began in 2003, when the organisation was awarded the project to work with the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) Schools. The service was to provide meals to the children from age group of 4 – 12 years in the given nutritional parameter, which was the daily requirement of a growing child as per the

World Health Organisation.

Under this scheme, mid-day meal was served with a minimum of 300 calories and 8-12 grams of protein to all children studying in classes I – V. Upper Primary meals consisted of 700 calories and 20 grams of protein by providing 150 grams of food grains (rice/wheat) per child.

With support from the Delhi government and Sri Ram Institute, the organisation developed the meal plans, trained its staff, especially cooks to prepare the meals daily under given proportions. The target to package the food within two rupees per meal was achieved with the Food Corporation of India coming on board as supplier of raw grains, cereals and other items.

The organisation catered to approximately 20 thousand children across 128 Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) Schools during its flagship programme from its Matiala kitchen. For its service par excellence, food quality and hygienic preparations, the opportunity to expand operations was awarded to Ekta Shakti Foundation thus extending the services to Delhi Government Schools and 100 Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) schools catering to more than 60 thousand children.

High-end state of art, semi automatic kitchen units were set up to meet the speed, needs and



quality standards. Kitchen in Matiala was established in 2005, followed by another kitchen in the same area in the year 2008, capacitated to prepare meals for 1,60,000 and 75,000 children respectively, including adequate amount of vegetables, cereals, staple food like rice, poori and related items.

The mid day meal nutrition programme was highly appreciated by the authorities and saw visits from World Health Organisation (WHO). The organisation got an opportunity to work

with the state of Bihar in the year 2006 to implement a pilot project in two districts catering to approximately two lakh fifty thousand children. With service par excellence, this project got scaled up to another three districts catering to more than six lakhs children across five districts of Bihar.

The organisation is committed to reach more and more primary school children through the nutritional needs.



By the reporting year of 2014 -2015 the organisation exhibited remarkable growth increasing its service across 2 states through 14 semi kitchen units.

# BrahmShakti Special School

BrahmShakti Special School was conceptualised in the year 2005 with an intent to cater to the needs of specially abled children in the region of Matiala, Delhi. The school started its effective functioning in the year 2006 with an objective -

- To impart education and therapies to children with special needs.
- Providing pre vocational and vocational services with a view to make these children independent.
- To create dedicated and quality oriented professionals in the field.
- To provide therapies and impart counseling sessions.

With affordable services and growing need within the community the requirement of another branch was strongly realised thus resulting in the establishment of Dwarka branch in the year 2008, equipped with all facilities and services. The school caters to specially abled children who suffer from spectrums of Autism, Mental Retardation, Down Syndrome, Slow Intelligence, Cerebral Palsy, Speech and or Hearing Impairment or any other retardation.

The staff is highly qualified in their respective areas of expertise and are registered with the **Rehabilitation Council of India**. They are experienced and well versed in handling children with special needs.





## The school offers its services ranging from –

### **Speech Therapy**

A clinical programme designed to help differently abled children in improving their communication skills through training, exercises, involving sound repetitions and imitation. This helps them improve their facial muscle control and express their basic needs.

### **Physiotherapy**

Involves assessing, planning and implementing a holistic programme to improve, restore and maintain the physical and psychological well being of the child. The child is empowered with better motor skills and control of movements to an extent.

### **Early Intervention**

A system, to help the child at an early age preferably before the age of 5 years. It is a system-coordinated service that promotes growth and development of a child for a better life. Intervention at early age is much more effective and corrective measures are better, than done on later stages.

### **Occupational Therapy**

Helps and enables a child to improve their participation in daily routine activities such as self care, playing games, sense of daily concepts like use of money, manner, dressing, brushing and all daily life related skills.

### **Pre-vocational/ Vocational Therapy**

Is aimed at developing life skills in specially abled children to make them emotionally competent and economically independent.

She participated in the international event with support from both the Indian and Australian Governments and won prizes in the organised events.

Her journey from 2010 to 2015 has been inspirational and today she is a role model for many other students.



# Women Empowerment

Economic security is the ability of individuals, households or communities to cover their essential needs sustainably and with dignity. Ekta Shakti Foundation under its Life-Skills Programme conceptualised this vocational training programme in the year 2006. The initiative of Radhika Silai and Kadhai Kendra became functional in the year 2007 in Matiala, Delhi, to challenge the socio economic inequalities of the region and enable women and girls, towards the goal of self-reliance.

The primary objective of the training center is to create employment opportunities for disadvantaged adolescent girls and women, especially women widowed at an early age, who saw no support in the society. The programme offers certificate courses in cutting, tailoring, sewing and embroidery for employability and better opportunities.

Beneficiaries are selected through the

outreach programme by the team. Family in need is identified during field visits, enquiring with the local community and via direct requests. The shortlisted candidates, based on their attitude, approach, education levels, learning capabilities, personal verification and socio-economical conditions are enrolled for this programme. The certification course offered is for 6 months and 12 months based on the need and requirement of the candidate. Batches of 30-40 girls/women are trained in two sessions carried out as per course duration selected. The organisation liaisons with local boutiques, small scale set ups and training institutes to strengthen placements opportunities for the trained women and girls.

Apart from imparting training, the center also serves as a social platform to spread general awareness about health, hygiene and gender issues.



The organisation has set up a provisional corpus fund to support women and girls financially in setting up their own social enterprises. The organisation has taken initiatives in forming Self Help Groups (SHG) to encourage the spirit of supporting each other in need through access of self-generated common fund

systems. These Self Help groups are also linked with the local banks to initiate entrepreneurial activities.

The Centre has trained approximately 500 women and girls, of which most girls are adolescents and are living a decent life.

I have two children and my husband works as a mechanic. We both aspire to give our children good education and earning of one member was not enough. I joined this initiative and got an opportunity to work as the center head. I am not highly qualified but have completed my senior secondary and am trained in stitching and tailoring. Initially to teach young girls and women with no education background was very challenging, as I found it tough to explain them measurements, which is very important in cutting of the cloth. Gradually with support from the team, we devised a way to teach them in a way that would help them in their work. In the basic training course, we teach them to take measurements, cutting, tailoring, hemming, button tucking, embroidery and basic stitching. In an advance course we teach them to stitch blouses, salwar, kurtis, and other Indian wear. The alumni of the center do visit us sometimes and give us the feedback on how their life has changed for good. This feeling is very satisfying and this is one of the reasons I like being here.
